EMERGENCY

WHEN RESPONDING TO EMERGENCY ALARM BRING:

- A MOBILE PHONE
- FIRST AID KIT
- FIRE EXTINGUISHER
- DEFIBRILLATOR

This Emergency Procedure directs you:-

To react to an emergency as quickly as possible;
and

Not to place your life or the life of anyone
else in danger.

IF YOU HEAR THE ALARM OR ARE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY, RAISE ALARM any way possible such as:

- Sound car horn continuously or instruct someone to do so.
- Call out for help.
- Bang on caravan walls.
- Turn on car head lights, indicators or hazard lights, especially at night.



SUGGESTED EQUIPMENT FOR RALLIES



- 15amp power lead, up to 25 metres in length.
- Some sites only supply power from 10amp outlets.
- Cordlock or similar protective cover for joining power leads.
- Wheel chocks and levelling blocks for uneven sites.
- You may need several levelling blocks for some sites at showgrounds.
- Timber or block for jockey wheel and under van legs.
- Two lengths of food grade water hose - a 13 metre and a 7 metre length.
- Ropes and pegs for tying down caravan awing.
- Hammer.
- Spirit Level - for taking van levels, refrigerators need to be level to run efficiently.
- Y piece metal fitting to include taps.
- Hose joiners at least two - Preferably metal.
- Good quality snap on hose fittings.
- Tap fittings to suit 3/4" and 1".
- Tap Washers.
- Thread tape.
- Sullage hose (at least 5 metres) or sullage receptacle.
- Shovel or folding spade would be desirable.
- Small ladder.
- Suitable caravan jack (bottle jack).
- Set of spanners and screw drivers.

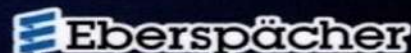
