Sadly, due to Mother Nature's intervention, Blackbutt once more became unviable due to the rainfall received in the preceding days and into the days that we would have been on site. In consultation with the venue's caretakers, who could not offer us sufficient power for the 40 vans expected, in an area unaffected by the water runoff, from over 150mls of rain, it was decided to reschedule our next attendance there until June of 2027. Hopefully the weather gods will be kinder then.

With nothing to report from a rally I thought I would reflect on our club's motto of 'Fellowship on Wheels'. Hence, off I went to Mr Google to see what the world of the internet thought this should mean and what I found was the following:

In caravaning term, "Fellowship on Wheels" refers to the social, community-focused aspect of traveling in caravans, motorhomes, or recreational vehicles (RVs). Our 'Sunshine Ladies' over the years have been very active keeping in contact with members who have found themselves in a less than desirable situation. This past year alone there have been close to 100 cards of support sent to members in these types of situations. On other occasions members have supported those who have needed help with their caravans. Be it for advice, help with upgrades or repairs, nothing is ever too much for our members. Outside our Club we can be justifiably proud of our donations to the RFD's and Lifelight and in the past couple of years our donations to local charities in lieu of the Christmas present exchange.

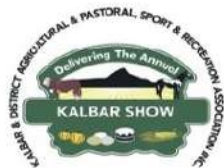

KALBAR SHOWGROUNDS CAMPING / CARAVAN – RULES & POLICIES

PLEASE TAKE A FEW MINUTES TO READ OVER
OUR CAMPING / CARAVAN POLICIES AND RULES

The Kalbar and District Agricultural and Pastoral Sports and Recreation Association Incorporated – known as Kalbar Show Society (KSS), manage the Kalbar Showgrounds where you have chosen to stay. The KSS is led by a committee of management who are the decision-makers, in consultation with the general members. To ensure your stay is safe and enjoyable, please read and observe the following conditions.

The KSS has a zero tolerance policy for any type of aggressive behaviour.

Check out : 10AM

A maximum stay of 41 nights is permitted.

Check In: 11AM

New arrivals

- On arrival please see the caretakers who will assist you to your site.

Vehicles

- We permit one (1) car and one (1) trailer or van per site. If you have additional vehicles an additional fee may be charged.
- All sites must have a driver and vehicle that can remove their camping/caravan at short notice.
- You **cannot** leave your caravan/campsite unattended for longer than **24 hours**

General

- Unfortunately we cannot guarantee a particular site, but requests will be considered.
- Prices are set annually.
- Payment is required on arrival, in advance of your stay.
- Only the KSS committee of management can approve use of additional power or water points, or buildings, for any purpose. Additional fees will be charged.
- We consider ourselves family friendly, where bicycles, scooters and skateboards are permitted. However, it is essential that safety equipment be worn at all times. For safety reasons no bicycles, scooters and skateboards are to be ridden after dark, or in buildings.
- Only persons authorised by the KSS are permitted to use any KSS equipment, including mowers, tractor and buggies.
- The KSS committee of management reserves the right to evict any person/s who fail to comply with the showground rules.
- Any person found to be damaging showground property, or property of other guests will be evicted and held responsible for repair costs.
- While the KSS do their best to ensure a safe and secure environment, we do recommend that visitors to the showgrounds take the precaution of securing items of value left outside their tent or caravan during the day or night.

Your site

- Please keep your site tidy and use the facilities provided for discharge of sullage water and rubbish disposal.

No generators are permitted

Speed limit

- In the interest of safety the speed limit is walking pace, no more than 10 kmls per hour, at all times.

Children

- Children must be accompanied by an adult when visiting the showers, toilets and any buildings within the showgrounds.

Trees

- Do not tie ropes or lines to trees.
- Do not climb trees.
- Trees around the showgrounds are inspected regularly, however trees and branches may still fall from time to time. Persons entering the showgrounds do so at their own risk. No responsibility will be accepted for personal or property damage caused by falling trees or branches.

Fires

- Community fire ban guidelines are applied at all times.
- Small self-contained fires off the ground are permitted.
- All rubbish must be put in bins not in any fires.

Noise and behaviour

- For the comfort of all guests no undue noise is permitted after 10.00pm. Excessive noise and rowdy parties will not be tolerated under any circumstances. Any such behaviour will result in eviction from these premises.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring that children do not disturb the peace and quiet of other guests.

Rubbish

- Please place only domestic rubbish in bins.
- All other items including large boxes are to be taken to the local refuse station. e.g. Broken chairs/ camping equipment

Smoking

- All showground buildings are strictly **NON-SMOKING**.
- Smoking is not permitted within 5 metres of buildings.

PET FRIENDLY POLICY (Maximum 2 Dogs)

Pets are most welcome here at the Kalbar Showgrounds, as we understand that dogs love to go on holidays too!

To ensure that you enjoy your stay with all of our other guests, we must ensure that all dog owners take full responsibility for their pet and ensure they do not disturb other guests when on the property.

Please read the information below to ensure you and your dog can meet the following conditions:

- Please discuss bringing your dog at time of making your booking.
- Under no circumstances are dogs permitted in the amenity blocks or buildings on the showgrounds.
- Dogs are only allowed to enter the property of other guests if prior consent is given.
- When in the showgrounds, dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.
- As the owner of the dog, you are responsible for the cleaning up after your pet, which also includes toilet duties too!
- No barking or yapping allowed.
- Dogs are not permitted to be left unattended within the showgrounds.
- KSS committee of management reserves the right to disallow any pet at the camping / caravan grounds that they deem not appropriate to stay at the camping / caravan grounds.
- All dog owners, whether you have expressly agreed or not, assume all liability regarding your dog being on our premises and indemnify us against all and any damages, all or any claims or other suits that may arise as a result of your dog being anywhere in our showgrounds. Any breaches of the above conditions could result in early departure and forfeiture of refund.

Camping Etiquette

Tips: How to Be The Camper Everyone Loves

Whether you're getting ready to go on your first or 50th camping holiday, it's a good idea to remember to be a polite camper.

Adhering to camping etiquette makes you someone who people are happy to have as their neighbours while on holiday. The following list of camping tips will serve as a reminder on how to be the camper that everyone loves.

Arrivals and Departure Times.

Do not arrive early to check in, there are jobs that need to complete before you arrive and before the office opens.

Be ready to check out on time. There are also jobs that need to be done after you leave, and we have limited time before the next camper arrives.

If you need to alter these times speak with your caretaker when booking

Facilities

Respect the facilities and leave them clean and ready for the next camper.

Turn off lights and ensure taps are turned off and not left dripping.

Don't walk through another camper's site

A major no-no in campsite etiquette is walking through another camper's area. There are always ways around sites. Just because it's faster to get to the bathroom through your neighbouring campsite doesn't mean you should do it. Be polite and go around—your friendly camping neighbours will be happy you did.

Water Connections

Check your water connections daily for leakage both at your van and tap. Nobody wants to be sitting in a wet boggy campsite because your water is leaking.

Noise

Keep in mind that not everyone stays up late or rises early. Making sure you're respectful of those around you and their schedules is an important part of following camping rules. So any noises from kids goofing around and talking loudly (i.e. partying late at night) to music and doors opening and closing on cars or vans are all part of what's subject to this noise rule. Keep it down!

Kids

Kids deserve to have wonderful memories of fun camping holidays. But we adults need to make sure the kids keep in mind that some campers don't want to hear kids before 7 am or have them running around the campsite late at night. It's important to be aware of your children's whereabouts, talk to them about being courteous campers (no throwing a ball through another camper's site, etc.) and help them follow the noise level rules.

Clean sites

Your campsite should always be clean and tidy, nobody wants to camp next to the city dump, this includes grass for those who have longer holidays.

Use a timer for lights

While there aren't any hard and fast rules for lights at most campsites, keep in mind how your lights might affect the other campers around you. Someone might be sensitive to light when trying to sleep, or perhaps they are attempting to admire the night sky. So either remember to turn everything off at a reasonable time or consider using a timer like you would on Christmas lights at your house.

Don't wash your dishes in the bathroom

Don't drag all your dishes to the bathroom and take up all the sink room. You could end up leaving gross food particles and other food residue where someone just wants to wash their hands or brush their teeth. Instead use the camp kitchen to clean your dishes.

Sullage hose & water

Don't drain your water on to another campsite and move your hose regularly so not to leave boggy spots for the next camper

Scrap your plates well before washing and cover the end of your sullage hose with a stocking or such, this will stop small animals such as frogs or cockroaches from blocking your hose. Also stopping rats and mice will in turn help not attract snakes.

Please change/clean your hose sock at least once per week as they tend to smell.

Dump Point

Please do not leave your engine idling while using the dump point the fumes from your engine linger long after you have gone.

DO NOT put wipes into the dump point while they may be flushable, they are not biodegradable.

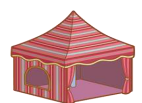

WHEN RESPONDING TO EMERGENCY ALARM BRING:
A MOBILE PHONE
FIRST AID KIT
FIRE EXTINGUISHER
DEFIBRILLATOR

This Emergency Procedure directs you:-
To react to an emergency as quickly as possible; and
Not to place your life or the life of anyone else in danger.

IF YOU HEAR THE ALARM OR ARE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY, RAISE ALARM any way possible such as:

- Sound car horn continuously or instruct someone to do so.
- Call out for help.
- Bang on caravan walls.
- Turn on car head lights, indicators or hazard lights, especially at night.

ASSESS EMERGENCY AND TAKE ACTION AS REQUIRED.

ACTIVATE EMERGENCY PLUS APP IF REQUIRED

- Open App on your phone.
- Follow prompts.

OR

DIAL 000 AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS.

Details of the nearest street or intersection are in the Club's First Aid Kit and in the "QCC Wanderer".

A COMMITTEE MEMBER WILL BRING THE DEFIBRILLATOR, FIRST AID BOX AND FIRE EXTINGUISHER

IF REQUIRED, OPEN AND FOLLOW PROMPTS ON THE DEFIBRILLATOR

COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO MANAGE SCENE UNTIL PROFESSIONAL HELP ARRIVES.

Preferably two committee members to act as follows:-

- One to assist at the emergency scene; and
- The other to manage communication with Emergency Services and with other QCC members.

A COMMITTEE MEMBER TO DIRECT OTHERS.

- To wait at entry point to direct emergency vehicles within the grounds.
- Some members may be required at intermediate points to help with directions for emergency vehicles.

IF YOUR ASSISTANCE IS NOT NEEDED AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY,

- Go to the designated **Emergency Assembly Point** and await instructions. If the **Emergency Assembly Point** has not been designated go to the main entrance of the hall and await instructions.

BE FAMILIAR WITH THIS EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

AND ALWAYS RESPOND TO AN ALARM.
